Key word	Definition
Gospels	The first four books of the Bible (Matthew, Mark, Luke John) that speak about Jesus' life, death and resurrection.
Holy Communion/ Lord's Supper/ Eucharist	A special activity in a church service where bread and wine is used to remember/partake in Jesus' death.
Holy Week	The week before Jesus' death, which begins on Palm Sunday.
Incarnation	God in flesh.
Martyr	A person who is killed because of their religious or other beliefs.
Resurrection	To come back to life.
Sacrifice	To give up something that is valuable to you, to help another person.
Salvation	An act of saving someone.
Substitute	To take the place of someone else.
